The Master of Divinity (M.Div.) is a comprehensive, pre-doctoral degree that combines theology and Christian ministry. The online or on-site program builds upon Northwestern's history and commitment to biblically based, evangelical theology.

The M.Div. will provide you with the knowledge and skills needed for roles such as pastor, minister, church planter, chaplain or missionary. Through in-depth coursework you will explore the knowledge, character and competencies needed for effective ministry.

M.Div. Course of Study

The Master of Divinity is integrated with Northwestern's Master of Arts in Theological Studies (MATS). The M.Div. program includes the MATS degree, adding courses in Bible exposition and Christian ministry.

The M.Div. is granted upon completion of 76 credits. Students who elect to do so may obtain both the MATS and M.Div. degrees for the complete course of study.

Integrated Internships

University of Northwestern's multi-faceted M.Div. program pairs excellent classroom or online courses with embedded field experience. Students learn how to apply what they learn to real-life ministry situations through their internship environments. As they collaborate, gain insight from active practitioners in their field, and put ideas and theology into practice, they are prepared to graduate with an excellent foundation in biblical theology and a thorough understanding of the realities of life in full-time ministry.

Program Delivery

 Class formats for the M.Div.:

On site: Come to class on campus one night a week.

Online: Interact online with professors and other students.

Time Frame M.Div. coursework can be completed in approximately 42–46 months.
