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# **2021-22 Senior Survey Results**



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## Introduction

This report summarizes the results of the University of Northwestern (UNW) Senior Survey administered to graduation seniors in December 2021 and May 2022 as part of the pre-commencement procedures. The survey was completed by 322 (82.8%) students of the graduating classes using an online format.

Data is also provided to show comparison with previous senior classes where available.

Items for the survey were selected by the Assessment Steering Committee with input from a variety of campus offices and committees.

Seniors were asked to rate their agreement with statements related to faculty in their major field. Strongly Agree = 4, Agree = 3, Disagree = 2, Strongly Disagree = 1
